# Furniture Bank exceeds 3-year goal for serving Wayne County families

In October 2015, with the support of United Way for Southeastern Michigan and the Community Foundation for Southeast Michigan, the Furniture Bank set a goal of providing beds and furniture to 315 Wayne County families over a three-year period, expanding its reach beyond Oakland and Macomb Counties.

The pilot project ended this past September with the Furniture Bank far exceeding its goal. We provided **418** Wayne families – or **1,258** people (422 adults and 836 children) – with **4,367** items of furniture, including **671** beds. Eighty percent of these families live in Detroit.

The Furniture Bank now seeks to raise \$300,000 to open a Wayne County facility. "Wayne is the largest county in the state, with the largest concentration of poverty, so the need is compelling," says Executive Director Robert Boyle. # Two new trucks will offer flexibility and capacity for furniture pickups

We've sold our 26-foot straight van after 11 good years of service, and have purchased two late-model 16-foot box trucks. This will leave us with a fleet of three 16-footers, "which increases our capacity for pickups and deliveries, and gives us more flexibility to better serve the community," Executive Director Robert Boyle explained.

A generous anonymous donor issued a \$13,500 challenge grant, and other supporters came through with another \$24,400. This totals \$37,900... a big thanks to everyone who helped!

The plan is to keep two trucks serving the area from the Pontiac facility, and the other to serve Wayne County from a Detroit location once it is secured (see related story at left).

## Bedding for Kids program takes off, with help of volunteers



One of the services offered by the Furniture Bank is the "Bedding for Kids" program. Many thanks to the volunteers and donors who make this program happen for our families.



The Furniture Bank has a "Beds for Kids" program that accepts gently-used twin beds or purchases new ones with a donation of \$100 so a local child will no longer have to sleep on the floor. Tax-deductible donations (beds or money) can be made at www.furniture-bank. org/beds-for-kids.



Tami Jelinek, the Lead Volunteer for our Bedding for Kids Program:

### WHO:

A group of volunteers partnering with the Furniture Bank of Southeastern Michigan to provide bedding for children (ages 1-17) who are receiving new beds, usually about 15 per week. In many cases, families were recently homeless and their children have not had a bed of their own. "The smiles I've had a chance to see on many of their faces is a big reason I continue to be passionate about this project!" Jelinek said.

## WHAT:

This "Friends of Furniture Bank" volunteer team provides twin bedding sets to be given with every bed. Sets are chosen and tagged with a child's name. When children receive the bedding, they see their names on it and know that someone picked this cozy, colorful bedding set out just for them!

## WHEN:

The Furniture Bank gives out approximately 60 beds per month, and most are twin beds for children. That's a lot of bedding! Opportunities to donate are ongoing, and we try to keep a curated assortment of kids' bedding on hand in "inventory," to stay ahead of demand. Having groups do bedding drives is a huge help. Follow our Facebook group page, "Friends of Furniture Bank Bedding for Kids" for information about what is needed. Private message Jelinek or comment on a post to help.

### WHERE:

Bedding donations may be brought to the Furniture Bank warehouse, or pickups can be arranged.

## WHY:

"My husband, Keith, and I have supported the Furniture Bank for several years," Jelinek said. "Through my involvement as a donor, volunteer, and team member in both organizations my heart has been increasingly drawn to the needs of families all around us. They are our neighbors."

## Frequently asked questions: Yes, yes and yes!

A few answers to questions you may be asking:

- Yes, donations are tax deductible. You will receive an in-kind donation receipt for the total value of your donation.
- Yes, stay in touch through our Facebook group. Ask to be put on our email list whether you donate often, one time, or not at all and just want to be informed. Share this opportunity with others.
- Yes, we would prefer that donations be complete bedding sets (bed-in-a-bag sets are good). However, we will happily accept bedspreads or sheet sets "a la carte" and will mix and match those to make complete sets. We also accept mattress pads.
- Yes, donate bedding at any time. We need twin bedding sets for young boys and girls, pre-teen boys and girls, and teen boys and girls. Having a good assortment on hand from each of these categories will help us stay ahead of demand.
- Yes, help is welcome for delivering, sorting, tagging, for anyone with time to give.
  Jelinek will also help you organize a bedding drive for your church or community group.
